




Symptoms

- Spontaneous bleeding
 - Large or deep bruises
 - Joint pain and swelling internal bleeding
 - Random bleeding or bruising
 - Blood in urine
 - Nosebleeds
 - Tightness in joints



Characteristics

- More serious complications-
 - Bleeding into:
 - Joints
 - Muscles
 - Brain
 - Other internal organs



Who Is Affected?

- Women may be carriers
 - · Passed down to children
 - Males have 50% chance of getting disease
 - Females have 50% chance of carrying disease
- Hemophilia is mostly in men
 - · Men only have one X-chromosome
- All age groups
 - Mostly children

Diagnosis

- · Family history of hemophilia
 - Fetus testing
- Blood testing from a child or adult
- Diagnostic Testing
- Carrier Testing



Treatment

Replacement of the missing clotting factor

Desmopressin

· Injected into vein

Can be given as nasal medication

· Helps body release factor VIII
